GreenStone FCS Announces Board of Director Election Results

GreenStone Farm Credit Services is pleased to announce the election results for four seats on its Board of Directors along with the Nominating Committee.

In Region I (Michigan), incumbents Lynn D. Gould, from Clare County, and Gilbert E. Ritter, from Saginaw County, were re-elected for three-year terms. Gould, a six-year board member, rotational grazes over 600-head of beef cattle, consults on oil and gas, wind power, and farm operations and management, and owns and operates a bed and breakfast inn. Ritter, a 19-year board member, farms with his son in a cash-grain operation where they grow over 900 acres of corn, wheat and soybeans.

In Region II (Michigan), incumbents David J. McConnachie, from Sanilac County, and Scott A. Roggenbuck, from Huron County, were re-elected to three-year terms. McConnachie, a 12-year board member, is in partnership on a 3,800 acre cash crop farm producing sugar beets, corn, wheat, dry beans and soybeans. Roggenbuck farms in a cash crop and beef finishing operation including 1,800 acres of corn, wheat, soybeans, dry beans and sugar beets; the three-year board member also operates a Pioneer seed agency.

The 2010 Nominating Committee included from Region I: Derek LeCronier, Bay County; and Joel Wardin, Saginaw County; from Region II: Scott Shaw, Sanilac County; and David C. Thuemmel, Huron County; from Region III: Jeffrey Bristle, Washtenaw County; William Choate, Jackson County; and Gerald Heck, Monroe County; from Region IV: Raymond R. McKenzie, Cass County; Brian Tetzke, Berrien County; and Jan Vosburg, Kalamazoo County; from Region V: Keith A. Bouwkamp, Newaygo County; and Michael Rasmussen, Montcalm County; from Region VI: Patrick Feldpausch, Clinton County; and Aaron Gasper, Ionia County; and from Region VII: Mary Eggert, Outagamie County; and David Goers, Shawano County.
